Our Summer Day Camp program is designed for young children that have finished Kindergarten through 4th Grade.

This summer, our campers will learn more about a wide range of topics with themed challenges rooted in science, technology, engineering, art, and math (S.T.E.A.M.). Along with our activities, we also have exciting and fun field trips planned for our campers. Take a look at the fun summer we have planned and register your child today.

Session 1: An Adventure Across Texas May 28 - June 7 (Closed May 27)

Join us as we dive into the heart of Texas. Campers will learn about the unique geographic regions of the state and the various animals that inhabit each area. Students will create their own model biomes of their favorite regions. This session will include a field trip to the newly-remodeled **Science and Natural History Museum** to view gigantic dinosaurs, and a visit from **Georgetown Homestead Mobile Petting Zoo**.

Session 2: Musical Madness June 10 - June 21 (Closed June 19)

We're learning all about what the Live Musical Capital of the World has to offer. Students will learn about music and rhythm and will work on writing their own songs. We'll learn more about the "Texas Royalty" of musicians and the different genres that are prominent in our state.

Session 3: Art Adventures June 24 - July 5 (Closed July 4)

Campers will learn about various artist that call Texas their home and will work on collaborative murals. We'll focus on the performing arts and our students will rehearse and perform their own short play. Our students will also take a field trip to the **movie theatre** to catch a film and paint their own pottery at **The Art Garage**.

Session 4: Cooking - Farm to Table July 8 - July 19

We're putting on our chef's hat and learning all about cooking! Campers will explore the science of baking and use their measurement skills to cook pizza, ice cream, and other fun treats. Students will enjoy a field trip to **Sweet Eats Fruit Farm** and learn more about the farm-to-table process.

Session 5: Sports Explorers July 22 - August 9

Texas is the proud home to many professional athletes and Olympians. We will combine themes of teamwork and sportsmanship as we learn about various sports and athletes. The 2024 Olympic Games will be held in Paris, France, our campers will work collaboratively on team activities and will participate in our own Field Day. Campers will visit **Playland Skate Center** to enjoy a day of fun and will be visited by **Games2U**.

Bluebonnet Treat Other People Right Agreement

Safety is our prime concern. In Bluebonnet Summer Camp, we hope to have field trips away from campus in our 15-passenger buses. We take many precautions'; children all wear identical brightly colored t-shirts, our buses are equipped with factory-installed, three-point child-sized seat belts. A cell phone is in each bus along with emergency information about each individual child. Teachers are well-trained and have first-aid & CPR certifications. If a child acts out at Bluebonnet Summer Camp, Bluebonnet reserves the right to exclude a child from field trips and to disenroll; and, we have the following field trip rules for children to follow. Please discuss them with your child.

- · Always stay with your counselor.
- Respect the place we are visiting.

Listen to the counselor in charge and follow the counselor's instructions.

We strive to make Bluebonnet School an enjoyable place for every child, where they can relax, enjoy themselves and learn a lot. To help children respect the rights of others while enjoying themselves, we use the Bluebonnet Treat Other People Right Agreement. We believe that children know right from wrong in most situations and happenings in their lives. They know when they are treated with respect and when they treat others with respect. Children usually know when inappropriate behavior from others makes them feel bad, and they also know when they do or say something that hurts others.

Parents, please talk with your child about the Bluebonnet Treat Other People Right Agreement. Let them know your high expectations of their behavior toward others. Then together sign this form and return it to us. We always expect each child to treat others right, but sometimes that does not happen. Here are the steps we will follow when things do not quite go as they should.

- 1. First we will talk with the child. If a child has not treated other people as they should, the counselor will discuss with the child what has happened and will help the child determine what would be a better choice of action.
- 2. Next the child may be asked to take a "cooling off" time. If the child continues to misbehave, the child will be asked to remove himself or herself from activities for a short cooling off period. The counselor will make a formal written note of these actions, while counselling the child further.
- 3.If counselling and cooling off fail to persuade the child to treat other people right, a parent will be informed of the events. The parent will be shown the written account and a formal incident report will be written and given to the parent.
- 4. If a child further continues to mistreat other people, that child may be asked to leave the program. Asking a child to leave our program is a very serious event and we hope this will not be a possibility. No refunds will be given.

Bluebonnet's Accreditation

Bluebonnet School of Cedar Park is NAEYC accredited. NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children) awards the most rigorous child care accreditation in the country and is considered the "gold standard" of child care nation accreditations. Its standards encompass teacher education, curriculum, teaching styles, parent communication, positive relationships, and other topics. There are over 9000 licensed centers in Texas, but only approximately 300 are NAEYC accredited.



Bluebonnet School of Cedar Park also holds the highest rating of a four-star designation with Texas Rising Star - a state-level certification created by the Texas Workforce Commission to highlight quality programs in the state.





Swim Lessons

Waterloo Swimming will offer swim lessons at Bluebonnet School of Cedar Park, Monday through Thursday on a weekly basis to children ages three and up, 4 lessons a week.

All enrollments and payments will be handled online at the Waterloo Swimming website at www.waterlooswimming.com/bluebonnet. Group sizes will be no larger than 4 children, and parents will receive an email with a progress report for each child at the end of each week of swimming.

Know the Facts about State Regulation of Summer Programs in Texas

Bluebonnet is licensed by Texas Health & Human Services Child Care Regulation. Child Care Regulation closely monitors and frequently inspects centers without prior announcement and requires facilities to always be in compliance with its 233-page Minimum Standards. Licensing inspects regularly with surprise visits to ensure that all rules are followed. But keep in mind that these rules are only "minimum standards".

Parents need to know which agency, if any, licenses their child's summer camp program. Many "summer camps" are not required to be licensed by any Texas state agency at all, leaving children in Texas at risk. Parents concerned about the safety of their children should prefer programs following the more comprehensive standards of Texas Child Care Regulation.
